The feeling on the part of the listener that what is being heard is actually the original version (or could be the original version) of the work, is the measure of the arranger/transcriber's success, both from the technical and artistic points of view. It is the goal which we seek to attain for each work selected for inclusion in this series.

Program Note

The "Water Music" by George Frederic Handel is among the most sublime music ever written originally for outdoor performance. It is one of the earliest works written by Handel during his years in England. The music was written to accompany a royal party, thrown by the newly-crowned King George I, which traveled by barge down the Thames River from Whitehall to Chelsea and back. The first performance, during July of 1717, was well-received by the king and, along with the popular success of his operas, helped to secure Handel's position as royal composer in London.

The "Water Music" is a collection of Baroque dances, overtures, and airs. Although the original order of the various movements is unknown, the music is generally divided today into three suites based on key. The two movements included in this transcription are from the "Suite In D".

Performance Notes

To obtain an authentic Baroque-sounding interpretation of this piece, wind instrumentalists would do well to take inspiration from the *detache* bowing used by string players in the performance of music from this period. For the wind player this means individual notes should be well articulated, sustained with energetic wind support, and slightly separated.

When a note that is trilled is tied to another note, the trill will stop on the second note. The inverted mordent sign indicates a short, rapid alternation occurring on the beat between the written note and the note immediately above it.

The many existing recordings of this music may also serve as wonderful teaching examples to students who are being introduced to the performance of Baroque music.

The Arranger



Robert Longfield is an award-winning composer, arranger, and educator. Born and raised in Grand Rapids, Michigan, he graduated with honors from the University of Michigan where he studied with Jerry Bilik and Paul Boylan and was a member of the band under William Revelli and George Cavender. He also earned a degree from the University of Miami where he was a student of Alfred Reed.

For fifteen years Mr. Longfield was the band and orchestra director at Davison High School, Davison, Michigan. Since 1987 he has held a similar position at Miami Palmetto Senior High School, Miami, Florida. Mr. Longfield was the recipient of the "Teacher of the Year" award by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association. In 1996 he received the "Mr. Holland Award" from the National Academy of Recording Arts and Sciences for outstanding contributions to music education.

A member of ASCAP, Mr. Longfield has received several commissions and his compositions and arrangements have been played and recorded by bands throughout the United States as well as in Europe and Japan .
