Rehearsal Suggestions

LEGEND OF THE IDA GLENN is a programmatic work which is divided into five distinct sections. First, (M. 1-10) is a "prologue" which introduces the three-note "I-da Glenn" theme (derived from the three syllables of the name) which is used throughout the piece. This introduction establishes a somewhat "heroic" mood, but also utilizes dissonant elements to foreshadow the "hardships" of the frontier "oil boom" life style.

The second section (M.11-50) represents the "quest" for adventure, fame, and fortune. The "I-da Glenn" theme is transformed into a driving melodic force, reminiscent of the new frontier of the early 1900's.

The slow section (m. 51-85) reflects the solitude of the years spent in search of the "black gold" that transformed the barren frontier into an industrial petroleum complex.

The transition which begins with the bass drum and cymbal "rumble" in measure 85 and gradually builds to measure 96 represents the "strike" when oil was discovered and a new industry was born.

The concluding section (m. 96-end) is a return of the "quest" for adventure theme.

The conductor should pay special attention to balancing the dissonant chords of the opening section. Emphasis should be placed on dynamic contrast and interpretive fluidity throughout.

Program Notes

As dawn was breaking on the morning of November 22, 1905, Robert Galbreath was shaken from his cot by the drill crew members of the Ida Glenn #1. It was to have been the final day of drilling and an end of a dream as money and men were both exhausted. Instead came shouts of "OIL! OIL! MY GOD, BOB, WE GOT AN OIL WELL!"

Robert Galbreath had come to the Creek Nation, Indian Territory, in 1901, and on July 3, 1903, had secured permission from Roger and Ida Glenn to do a test drill on their Creek land allotment. When oil was struck on November 22 of 1905, the surrounding area changed drastically: oil derricks sprang up as far as the eye could see; towns and businesses to supply the boom population multiplier (Tulsa went from a small cow town to the Oil Capital of the World); train service expanded; and reaching out from the "Glenn Pool", pipelines were laid which extended from Port Arthur, Texas, on the Gulf of Mexico, to Chicago, on the Great Lakes. Thus began the great Oklahoma oil boom.

THE COMPOSER



Ed Huckeby currently serves as an Associate Professor of Music and Music Department Chairman at Northwestern State University in Alva, Oklahoma. Prior to his appointment at Northwestern in 1976, he spent eight years teaching instrumental music in the public schools of Oklahoma. His first teaching assignment took him back to his small hometown of Allen, Oklahoma. He then spent six years in eastern Oklahoma as Director of Bands at Poteau High School, where his marching, concert and jazz bands won state and regional acclaim. Huckeby's ability to write interesting and accessible instrumental works can be attributed to his varied experience at all levels of instrumental music. His success led him to a larger high school in Poteau and eventually into the college teaching ranks where he is internationally recognized as an outstanding music educator and composer.

Oklahoma born, raised and educated, Huckeby describes his talent for musical composition as a "gift" which has been evolving since his youth. His creative flair and eclectic musical interests have been displayed in a variety of styles, including pop, country and broadway vocal and instrumental arrangements, as well as original compositions in the gospel and contemporary Christian fields. His outstanding contributions to the concert and marching band literature have played an important role in the development of the contemporary band repertoire. His performance background is just as eclectic, having been a member of a symphony orchestra (horn), a jazz band (trumpet), and a contemporary Christian quintet (bass guitar and vocals).

Ed holds a B.A.Ed in music from East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, an M.Mu.Ed from the University of Oklahoma, and an Ed.D. in Administration from Oklahoma State University. He has written music education articles for *The Instrumentalist*, *The American Music Teacher*, and *The Journal of the International Horn Society*. He is a member of the national board of directors and state chapter president. He has been selected as an "Outstanding Young Man in America" and is listed in the "International Who's Who in Music."

Thirteen of Huckeby's most popular band compositions have recently been recorded by *The Washington Winds* and are available on a new Walking Frog Records compact disc entitled "Of A Distant Star".

Ed, his wife, Latricia, and their two daughters, Angela and Amanda, make their home in Alva, Oklahoma where, in addition to his duties as a university professor and administrator, he serves as a church organist.
